WATER FILTRATION EXPERIMENT IN GRADE 3 YELLOW

NEW FACES AT BIS: MR ROBERT

My name is Robert Fenn and I have long had a passion for science and education.

Having obtained a Botany degree from Nottingham University, I was able combine this with my love of aviation by completing an MSc at Cranfield University in Bio-Aeronautics. This lead to me spending two years with the Aerial Spraying Research and Development Project in Zimbabwe researching ways of eliminating the dread tsetse fly from the African bush.

After completing my research project, I returned to the UK and joined the Natural Resources Institute being involved in



many varied projects involving novel ways of killing things including using insect growth regulators against armyworm in Zambia and Tanzania, and viruses against various unfortunate caterpillar species in the lab in Kent.

Slowly I metamorphosed into a project manager finding myself some years later working as an IT & Facilities Manager and Health & Safety Officer for a medium sized company also involved in international development.

Soon I yearned once again for foreign adventures and so headed to Scotland and retrained as a teacher. After a year working at Abertay University in Dundee I accidentally got a teaching job in Kathmandu Nepal, since when I have worked in United Arab Emirates and latterly in Malaysia where I was Head of the International School.


