PRESCHOOL 2

It's been another wonderful week here in Preschool 2! We've had a lot of fun and learning in our classroom.

This week, we focused on taking care of ourselves and those around us by learning about something very small but important - germs! We found out that germs are tiny, invisible creatures that can make us sick. By washing our hands correctly, we can protect ourselves and others from spreading germs. We learned that germs can be found not just on our hands but also on our clothes, toys, and almost everywhere! With the help of magnifying glasses, our little friends took a closer look at our toys to see these tiny germs up close.

One of the most exciting things we did this week was

a glitter germ experiment. We added glitter (representing germs) to the water and watched as they quickly moved away when we added soap. It was a good demonstration of how germs are scared of soap. After that, we interacted with these "germs" (glitters) and practiced proper handwashing techniques at the sink to ensure our hands were clean.

In our math lessons, we explored triangle shapes. We used Lego constructions to make triangles, making learning about shapes interactive and fun.

It's been a great week, and we look forward to more exciting adventures in the coming weeks.
