

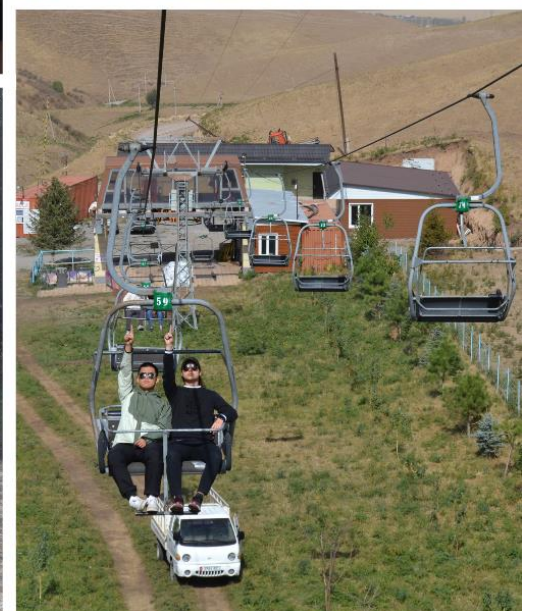


GRADE 12 FORM TRIP TO CHOLPON ATA

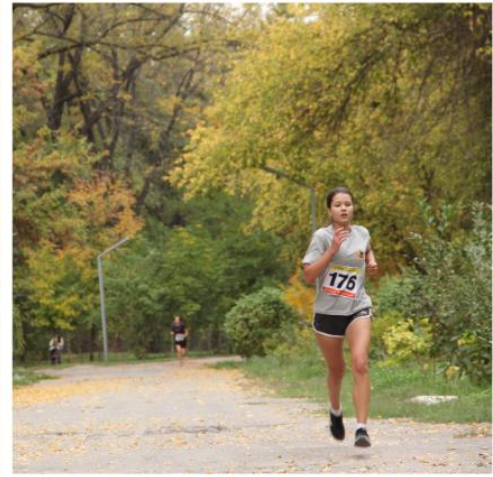

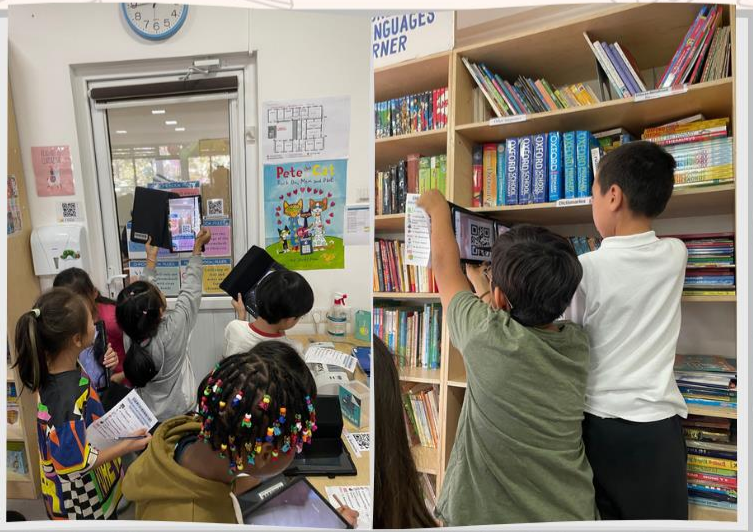
LIBRARY SCAVENGER HUNT

The youngest kids in grades 0-1 explored the library finding hidden book characters and telling us their names. They were super excited and did a great job!

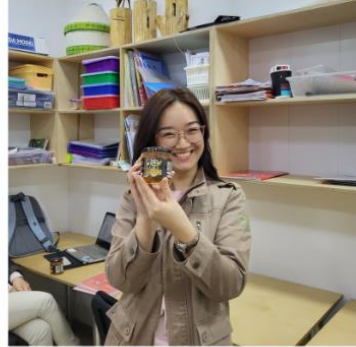
The older students in grades 2-5 used school tablets to find QR codes hidden around the library. When they scanned the codes, a secret message was revealed.
