

EXPLORING KYRGYZ CUISINE AT NAVAT

During an exciting trip as part of a Kyrgyz language lesson, 6th grade students visited the Navat restaurant. They learned the history and evolution of the restaurant, which is presented not only in Kyrgyzstan, but also in Moscow, Chicago and Dubai.



Navat started with Kyrgyz dishes, expanding the menu with Asian and European dishes. And the word "navat" itself means a crystallized piece of sugar and honey. Students asked questions, practiced their spoken Kyrgyz language skills, and showed interest in the Kyrgyz culture and cuisine.















EXPLORING LUNG ANATOMY THROUGH DISSECTION



During the Biology lesson, Grade 10 students engaged in a lung dissection experiment, exploring the anatomical structures and functions firsthand. They carefully dissected lungs, identifying key components such as bronchi and alveoli, enhancing their understanding of respiratory systems. This hands-on activity provided valuable insights into lung physiology and reinforced classroom learning.
