
SECONDARY SCHOOL WINTER SPORTS DAY

BIS Snapshot: Winter Sports Day


































This week Grade 0 marked the Feast of Sada, a Tajik festival that celebrates light over darkness and warmth over cold. With the help of some of our parents, we learned that special foods eaten at this time include a dish called dalda, which is made of wheat, Tajik bread called kulcha, and sambusa (samsa), made with meat or mashed potatoes, or with pumpkin. The students made kulcha, which linked to food chains, currently being taught in our Unit of Inquiry. As the students already knew by making braided bread, the dough they kneaded to make kulcha was made from flour, and flour comes from a plant – wheat. All plants use the sun to create their own food, and therefore wheat is a producer. Producers are the base of food chains. Wheat is eaten by other animals, including humans, who are consumers. Grade 0 not only consumed and made the bread, but enjoyed it as a tasting and cultural experience.



YAHYA CHOCOLATE MASTERCLASS

Grade 3 Yellow has been studying the Mayans and all their wonderful innovations. The Mayans were particularly fond of chocolate, both as a drink and as a sign of wealth. They did not add sugar to cacao like us, but added chili peppers and cinnamon.

We stayed away from the spices and enjoyed creating white, milk, and dark chocolates.

Children also learned the history of cacao and the fascinating process of turning cacao beans into a sweet treat.



















SCIENCE ADVENTURES: HANDS-ON EXPERIMENTS IN THE CLASSROOM

In Grade 7, our students delved into the captivating world of chemistry, uncovering secrets hidden within humble kitchen ingredients. Using red cabbage and beetroot, they crafted their own pH indicators, immersing themselves in a colorful exploration of natural chemistry.

This hands-on experiment unveiled the acidity and alkalinity of everyday vegetables, inviting others to join us in unlocking the potential of red cabbage and beetroot for understanding pH levels.













Through further experimentation, they explored the acidic and alkaline properties of various liquids like HCl and NaOH, deepening their understanding of chemical reactions.

Their immersive learning experience honed laboratory skills and sparked a lasting passion for scientific inquiry.
