


























is taken to the city through pipes.

First we explored the pipes that send water to Bishkek, and we learned that in 1 hour 15,000 cubic meters of water is sent to Bishkek. Wow! Then we went inside the water filtration building and learnt how Bishkek's water is filtered. Did you know that the water comes from great reservoirs up to 250m underground? 

PRESCHOOL 1

PRESCHOOL 2

This week at Preschool 2, our friends continued their exploration of emotions. We know that everyone experiences different feelings, and it's okay to feel them all. However, sometimes we might feel angry or overwhelmed, which can lead to unintentionally hurting others or feeling upset ourselves. To address this, we discussed strategies for managing these emotions without causing harm. We practiced counting backward from 10 to 1 and taking deep breaths, as well as trying out rainbow breathing. Additionally, we created sensory bottles to help us

calm down when we're feeling anxious or overwhelmed. It was a valuable learning experience for everyone. In literacy, we focused on the phonic sound "i" and crafted igloos. In math, we reviewed patterns, and during our art lesson, we made expressive feelings and faces. We also had guests; Grade 1 Yellow students came and read their own books, which we thoroughly enjoyed. Overall, it was a fantastic week filled with growth and exploration.

It's incredible how much they already know!

In our Language class, we expanded our vocabulary with words like tusks, stripes, spots, cub.... We also encouraged the kids to share their favorite jungle animal stories, allowing them to practice their speech and storytelling skills.

Math became an adventure as we practiced counting skills. The kids amazed us by counting from 1-26 with their jungle animal toys! We also had fun sorting animals into different categories, distinguishing jungle animals from others like water and farm animals.
