# GRADE 2 BLUE'S SUSTAINABLE CRAFT

Grade 2 Blue made their own homemade paper from recycled paper. They cut the paper into small pieces, soaked it in water for a few days, and then crushed it into pulp. Then, using a wooden frame and screen, they formed the pulp into a thin sheet and let it dry.









After the paper dried, they were amazed by the unique textures and colors that emerged, each piece telling its own story of transformation. It was a challenging but fun process.

















# GRADE O'S PERFORMANCE OF SHADOWS





Grade 0 put on a shadow puppetry performance at the assembly last Friday, inspired by the Wayang Kulit art form of Indonesia and Malaysia.

The students are currently studying about forces in science, and how they can cause objects to move or change direction. They learnt that different forces impact objects in their surroundings. The children performed two stories, "Little Red Riding Hood" and "The Three Little Pigs." In the latter, students identified the force of the wind (the huffing and puffing of the wolf) and its effects on different types of houses. During Grade 0's re-telling, "Little Red Riding Hood" had a new ending. The pull of an alien spaceship beamed up the wolf to stop it from eating the main character.

Applying the scientific concepts of push and pull linked also to the puppets themselves. In a Wayang Kulit performance, the puppet figures are often rearprojected on a taut linen screen with a coconut oil light. The narrator tells the story and puppeteers use deft hand movement to manoeuvre the puppets. Altogether they tell an entertaining tale, often with the theme of good versus bad. In Grade 0, the students brought the stories to life through teamwork: helping to make the puppets, waiting for the narrator and peers to speak, as well as interacting with the movement of the puppets themselves. The children learned how the figures should be manipulated between the flashlight and paper screen to bring the shadows to life.

Grade 0 had a great time putting on a performance that held the audience's attention with new interpretations of two famous stories.

#### **LET'S PLANT TREES**

BIS Student: "In our community we need to plant more trees because we have a lot of pollution. The highest rate of air quality in winter 2022 was around 500. Exceeding the 500 scale indicates the situation is terrible. At 500, maximum damage is done so there is no point going beyond that. This number increases every year during winter time. To prevent the dangerous hazards that are happening we need to plant more trees around our community".



BIS Student: "To improve the ecology of BIshkek we need to plant trees. And reduce global warming. You can see that the temperature in the city is hotter than in places with more greens. Places where trees grow have more oxygen than us".

BIS Student: "Our community needs more action in terms of the environ-

ment. Caring about the environment is one of our core values, so we have to stand by it. Planting trees has a lot of benefits. It improves the ecology, air quality, water quality and many more. The future generation needs better ecological conditions. The future generation is the generation in schools right now. Kids are the future so we need to plant trees to let them live in a world without smog and with clean air".















# GRADE 6 CHERRY BLOSSOM PAINTING

# SUPPORTING the

# HOMELESS COMMUNITY IN BISHKEK







In the city of Bishkek, there is a homeless population of about 3,500. These people have to live through the tense conditions of this city, from the unenduring heat of the summer, and unbearable temperatures of the winter. On top of this, they do not receive sufficient amounts of food and water. There is also a lack of organisations that shelter the homeless and hand out food to them. But, there are such organisations, and they need funding.

For our community project, me and my partner Bunne want to make sure that the homeless people living in this city, just like we are, get the food and shelter that they deserve. Some are starving, and others people die on the streets because of inadequate amounts of food and water. Some even die of hypothermia in the winter. None of this would be happening if these people were cared for, simply talked about.

The NGO Пища для Жизни is a group made up of volunteers who cook and deliver food for the homeless communities of Bishkek, and the greater Chüy Oblast region. NGOs like these rely on outside donations for their funding, and they don't get enough donations. Fundraising for NGOs is one of the most effective ways to support a homeless community. For example, Пища для Жизни, the NGO we supported, a donation of just 20 som is 1 person fed with a warm meal. Meaning, a donation of 2000 som, or about 22 dollars, would feed 100 people.

In February, we set up a donation box in the cafeteria for a fundraiser for "Пища для Жизни". This donation box was left up for about a month before all the money was collected and the donation box was taken down. The money totalled 3,811 som, which had to be transferred onto a credit card so that it could be transferred to the NGO digitally as they unfortunately did not accept donations by cash. This meant that we raised enough money to feed 191 people. With the money that we had donated to their cause, they bought ingredients for a batch of food, and delivered it to a group of orphanages in the city of Kara-Balta, a city about 1.5 hours away from Bishkek.

If anyone wants to donate to Пища для Жизни and their goals, you can transfer them money at their MBank at 0709 108 108, as any amount of money helps. Much thanks to anyone who donates, or anyone who has already donated via the donation box.


