

The French Revolution

The French Revolution (1789–1799). It began with the storming of the Bastille followed by establishment of the First French Republic, and Reign of Terror. Key figures: Robespierre and Marat. Napoleon Bonaparte seized power in 1799. The start of the Napoleonic era.



WW1 and WW2

France played key roles in both World Wars. WWI (1914– 1918) saw France and allies against the Central Powers. WWII (1939–1945) saw Nazi occupation, resistance led by de Gaulle, and eventual liberation, marking France's post-war reconstruction.



Post-War Period and Modernization:

After World War II, France experienced rapid reconstruction and modernization. The Marshall Plan aided in economic recovery, leading to the "Trente Glorieuses" (thirty glorious years) of economic prosperity and social progress in the post-war era. France became a founding member of the European Union, contributing to its integration and global influence.
