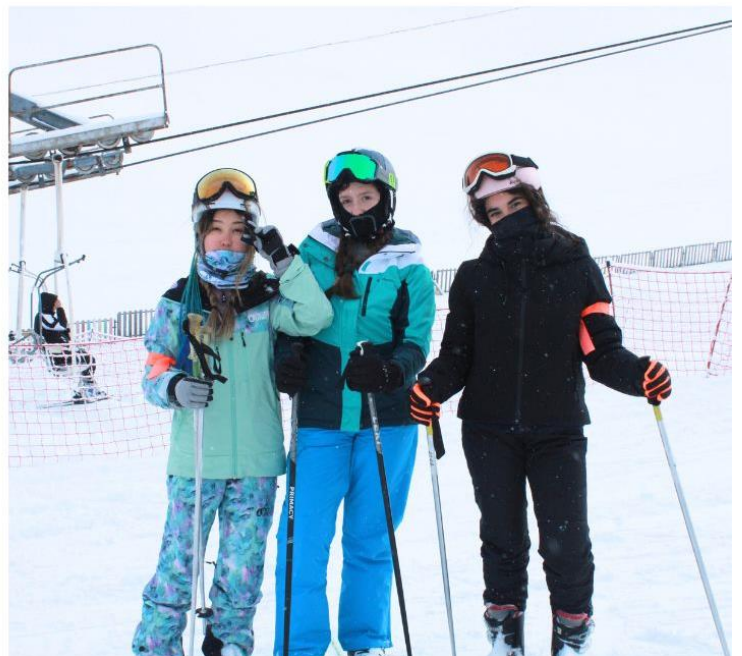

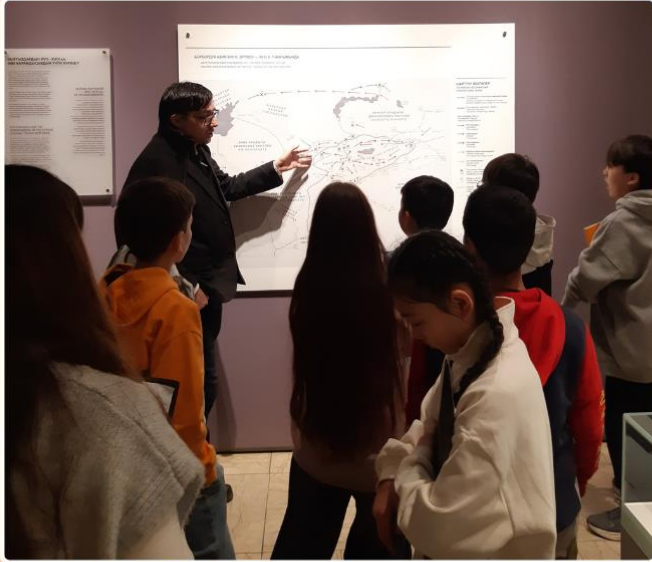
## SECONDARY SCHOOL WINTER SPORTS DAY

A huge thank you to everyone who contributed to making the day a success, especially the teachers who supervised on the slopes and ensured a safe and enjoyable time for all.



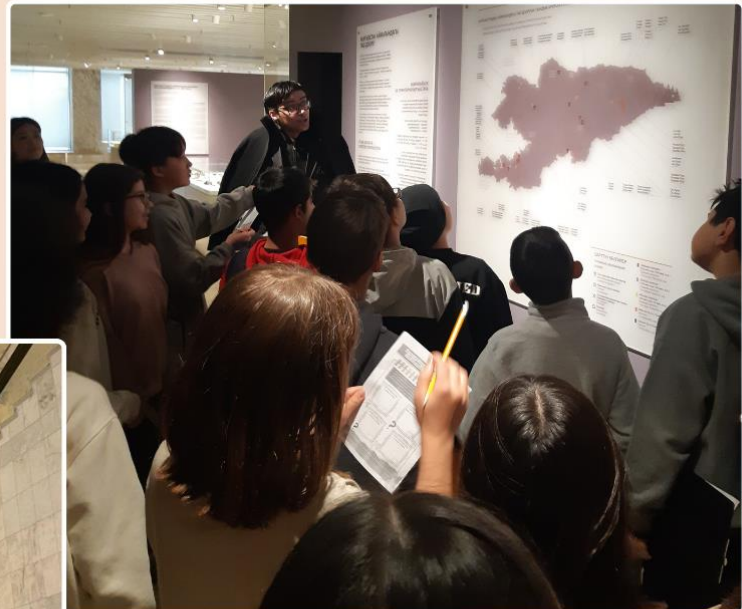
# EXPLORING THE PAST

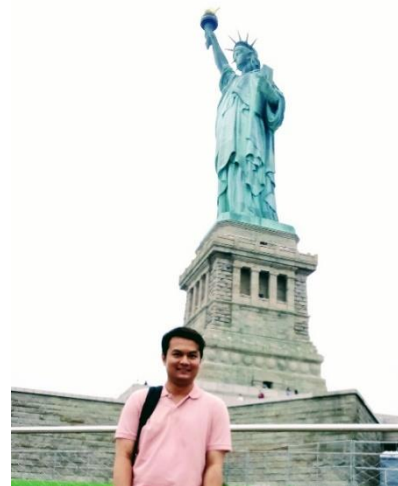

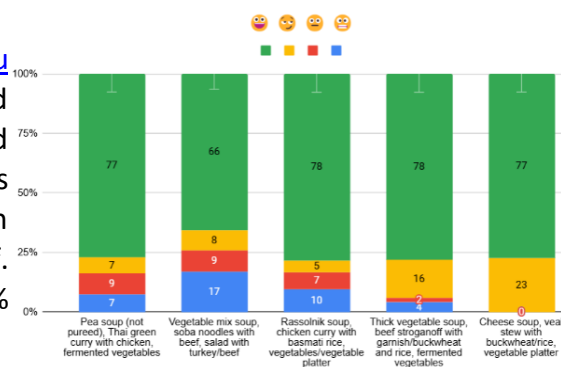

## SCHOOL FOOD – STUDENT FEEDBACK & NEW MENU

From Monday, 13 January 2025, we introduced a [new menu](#) designed by a professional nutrition specialist. Parents were invited to try this new menu, and they have been sampling the lunches and providing immediate feedback by selecting smiley or unsmiling faces on the café screen based on their satisfaction with the food each day. We have also been surveying students from G0–G12 and staff. **The results for Menu D are in the chart.** Green bars represent the % who gave the full smiley, orange bars the almost happy smiley.



However, the new menu has received even more complaints than ever before, this time mainly from students, including a petition signed by over a hundred students, demanding a return to the old menu. Some parents have also raised concerns based on feedback from their children. The school Nutrition Committee has taken all the feedback and surveys into account and prepared a [revised Menu A](#), including a vegetarian option including some of the most popular dishes from both the previous menu and new menu. This revised menu will be used for the week beginning Monday February 10<sup>th</sup>.

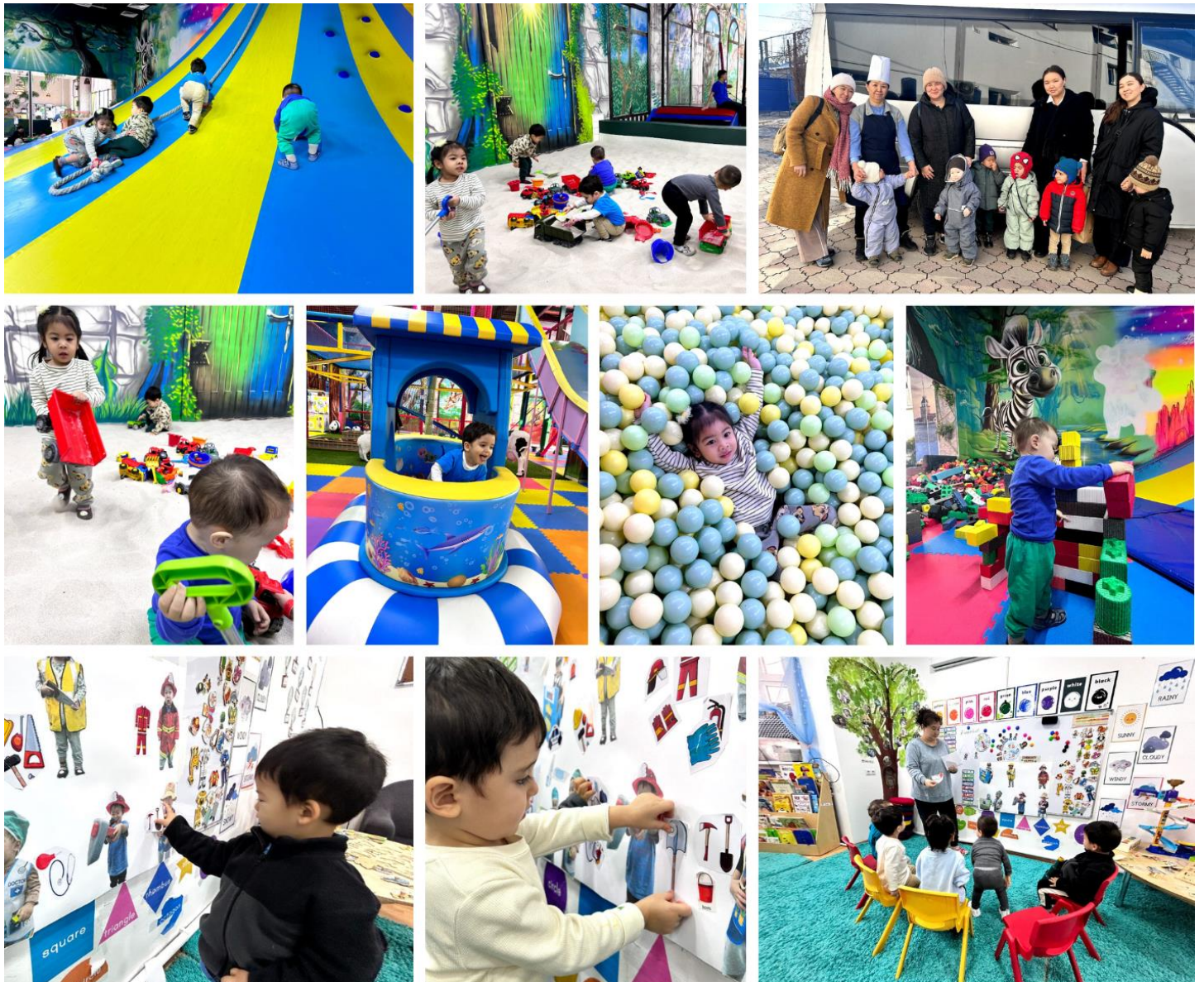


## PRESCHOOL 1

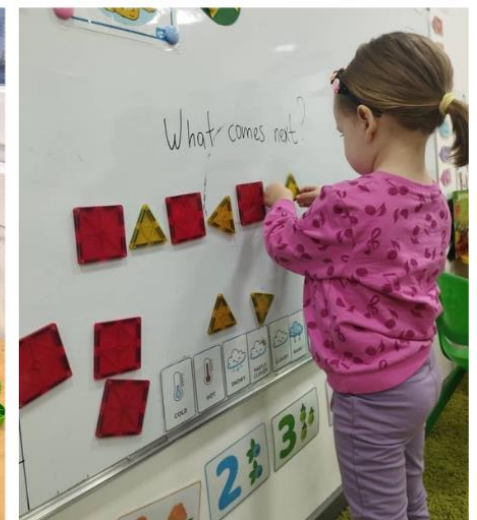


## PRESCHOOL 2

This week was packed with fun, adventure, and hands-on learning as we wrapped up our three type of Transport theme with **Water Transport!** The little ones were thrilled to explore different types of water transport, understand how boats float, and imagine themselves sailing across the ocean.

One of the highlights of the week was our **Sink or Float Experiment**, where we tested different objects to see what floats and what sinks. The children learned that **lighter objects float, while heavier ones sink**, and they loved making predictions before testing their ideas!

Creativity flowed during **art time**, where the kids **painted and decorated sailboats**, making each one unique and colorful. Outdoors, we had a blast with the **Water Relay Race**, where they carefully carried cups of water without spilling, a fantastic way to practice balance and patience.

To bring the ocean into our classroom, we transformed our space into a **mini ocean** with **blue cloths and toy sea creatures**.

The children eagerly played in their pretend boats, imagining themselves as little sailors and fishermen!

In **math**, we explored **3D shapes**, matching them to real-life objects—**spheres** (balls, globes), **cubes** (boxes), **cones** (party hats), and **cylinders** (cookie containers). **Phonics** was all about the letter “**R**”, with fun crafts like **rabbits and reindeer**, and an exciting milestone—**many children are now recognizing and beginning to write their names!**

To top it all off, we took a wonderful **trip to Ala Archa National Park** for our **Winter Sports Break**. The snowy landscapes were breathtaking, and the children had a fantastic time playing in the snow!
